Summer Timeline & To-Do List

→ MAY

- Confirm your AP scores were sent to Lehigh by logging in to the College Board website (code: 002365).
 - Check the Lehigh 2025-2026 catalog for AP equivalents.

→ JUNE

- Look out for an email with instructions on how to take your required ALEKS Math placement exam.
 - If you receive AP credits (score 4 or 5) for Calculus, you will not be required to take the ALEKS exam.

→ JUNE 16-20

- Attend a 'First-Year Registration Advising Session' with your Advisor.
 - Session dates are assigned based on your last name - monitor your Lehigh email for more information on which session to attend.

→ JULY 14-18

- Attend a 'First-Year Registration Advising Session' if you did not attend a June session, or would like a refresher.
 - Session dates are assigned based on your last name - monitor your Lehigh email for more information on which session to attend.

→ JULY 16

- Recommended deadline to complete your ALEKS training modules and retake the assessment to improve your Math placement.
 - If you improve your score after July 16, please contact your Advisor.
- Check your DegreeWorks Audit to see what courses you may already have received credit for. Familiarize yourself with your degree requirements.

→ JULY 21-31

- Register for your Fall 2025 courses through Banner using the info in this packet.

→ JULY 31

- Last day to make changes to your schedule before New Student Orientation.

→ AUGUST

- Connect with your Advisor if you are looking to make any changes to your schedule.

→ AUGUST 22

- Participate in the College of Business First-Year Student Welcome as part of your Lehigh Orientation.

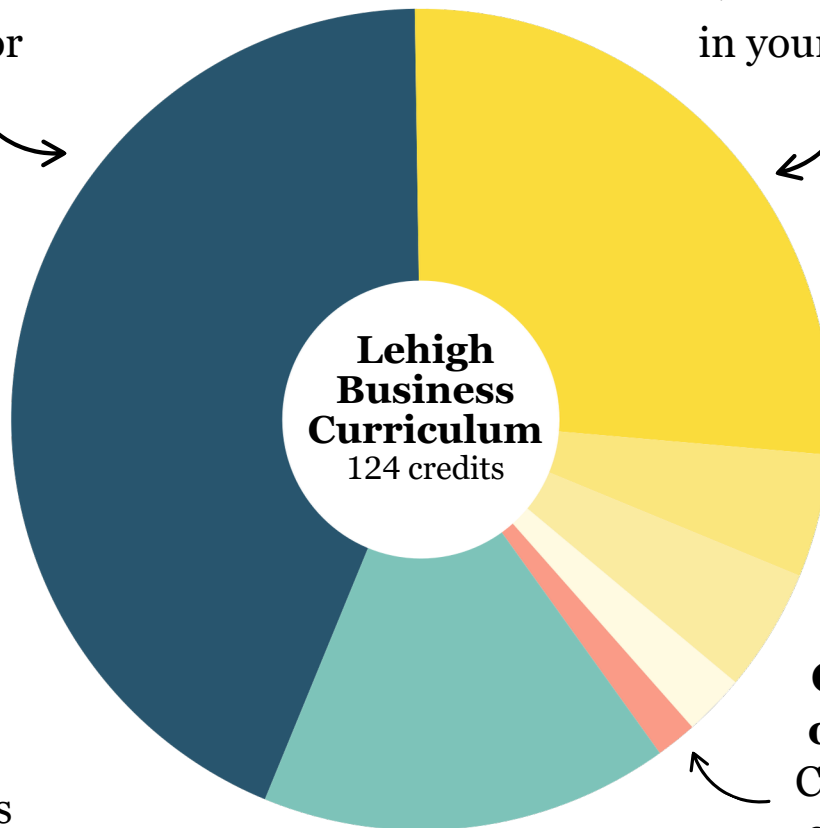

Students must also take 3 credits each of courses with the Diversity and Global attributes. These 6 credits may overlap with the above requirements.

Course Recommendations for Registration

Students should aim to register for 14-17 credits in their first semester, with 17 credits being the maximum amount students are permitted to take in their first term. To be considered full-time, students must be registered for a minimum of 12 credits. Below, you will find tiered recommendations based on what courses are required, recommended, and other potential options within your first year studies.

The Business Advising team curated two sample schedules to demonstrate what your first year may look like. Please use these sample schedules to guide your own registration. You may find that your schedule looks slightly different based on AP or transfer credits received, your Math placement recommendation, and/or course capacity. The Advising team is here to support you if you have any questions or scheduling concerns.
