The Tauck Scholars program provides unique educational and cultural opportunities for selected business students to participate in an international summer internship or program in a cultural setting that is “new or foreign to them.” Recipients of this award may select the type of international internship program they wish to pursue based on interest, qualifications, and career goals, as long as the internship program is Lehigh-led or organized through a Lehigh-approved program provider.

The Tauck Scholars also serve as goodwill ambassadors to Lehigh University by helping prospective scholars prepare for their international experience and participating in special College of Business activities.
