1. DISTRIBUTION REQUIREMENTS: fifteen (15) credits distributed across three (3) knowledge areas that develop you as a whole person and give you additional perspective and skill to solve complex problems better:

| 3. Science (NS) | 3 | - Study of the physical sciences <br> - Examples: Astronomy, behavioral neuroscience, biology, chemistry, computer science, earth and environmental science, mathematics, molecular biology, physics |
| Total Distribution Credits Required: | 15 |  |

$>$ Course designations of $\mathrm{HU}, \mathrm{SS}$, or NS are searchable on Banner during registration and noted in the University Catalog course descriptions. Economics courses cannot be applied to the College of Business social science distribution requirement.
$>$ After the minimum credits for distribution requirements are fulfilled, credits beyond the minimum are applied to fulfill the requirement of thirty-three (33) credits outside the College of Business.
$>$ Courses you take to fulfill HU or SS distribution requirements can simultaneously fulfill your Global or Diversity requirement. Check your degree audit to be sure the courses you select fulfill the requirements you expected.
2. UNIVERSITY (NON-BUSINESS) ELECTIVES: a minimum of thirty-three (33) credits outside of the College of Business beyond the fifteen (15) credits applied towards your distribution requirements. Gives you a chance to explore interests beyond business. Additional credits outside the College of Business can include:

- HU, SS, and NS courses from the College of Arts and Sciences, taken beyond (in addition to) the fifteen (15) credits required to fulfill distribution requirements.
- Courses from the Rossin College of Engineering and Applied Science.
- Up to six (6) credits of economics can be applied to non-business elective requirements. For double majors, no economics course can be double-counted as a (i) non-CBE electives, and (ii) major requirements.
> Courses taken to fulfill this thirty-three (33) credit requirement may simultaneously apply to a minor outside the business school. Minors can also be those offered by the College of Arts and Sciences or the Rossin College of Engineering and Applied Science, e.g.:

> Courses may simultaneously fulfill both your Global or Diversity requirement and the 48 required credits outside the College of Business. Check your degree audit to be sure the course you select fulfills all the requirements you expected.
